

Business for Inclusive Growth (B4IG) announces that Camille Putois has been appointed Chief Executive Officer of the coalition

The Business for Inclusive Growth (B4IG) coalition, launched at the G7 Summit in Biarritz last August, brings together the OECD and more than 40 multinationals and organisations to fight against inequality. Each coalition member has committed to advancing human rights and promoting more inclusive workplaces and ecosystems.

In today's context of a major global crisis that has made the fight against inequalities only more critical, Camille Putois has been appointed as CEO of the coalition.

Camille will provide overall leadership to B4IG's program of work, which consists of concrete and measurable actions to fight against inequalities, sharing and promoting the most innovative and successful initiatives, and developing new forms of public-private financial solutions to support inclusive business models.



Camille has held positions in the French administration (Deputy Chief of Staff to the Prime Minister, Ministry of the Interior), at Publicis Group (co-President and General Secretary of advertising sales business companies), and in consulting (Partner at Brunswick), before founding and leading a GovTech startup. She is a graduate of the Ecole Normale Supérieure, ENA, and Sciences Po.

This decision follows the unprecedented mobilisation of the coalition members in the face of the Covid-19 pandemic. Since the beginning of the crisis, the companies of the B4IG coalition have deployed more than 38 billion euros in donations, funds and payment facilities to support their employees, communities, clients and suppliers affected by the pandemic.
